
In this unit, we will learn about:

- *Know why dental hygiene is important



In **computing**, we are learning about digital images and how we create, manipulate and use them for different purposes.


In **PE**, we will be learning about swimming, gymnastics and dodgeball.

In **PE**, we will be learning about swimming and gymnastics.




In **DT**, we will be learning about what healthy means and learning how to cook healthy food.
